Mea Culpa

I must begin with an apology. It has been quite a while since my last edition of The Corner Stone. What with one project or another, this newsletter kept winding up on the back burner. I intend, therefore, to issue this edition as somewhat as a summary of recent goings-on here at the museum as well as an opportunity to reestablish The Corner Stone as a quarterly publication.

A Summary

Over the course of summer and fall 2010, the museum had on display a major exhibit featuring the art of Mr. Norman Maffei of Franklinville. Mr. Maffei is an accomplished artist in a number of media, particularly known for his oils and cartoons. Our exhibit featured many of his illustration and paintings that drew on his time in the artillery during WWII. We are grateful to Mr. Maffei for his interest and generous cooperation.

Our current exhibit is "Textile Arts of Cattaraugus County." Drawing on the museum's large collection of textiles, we have on display a number of items made by (much of it by hand) residents of Cattaraugus County. We have several lovely quilts (many from the turn of the last century), lace work,

needlework, and some woven items. Of particular interest is a family register done as a sampler by a nine year old girl in 1829. The exhibit will run through March. We encourage to come and see it!

A Call to Arms

2011 marks the 150th anniversary of the start of the Civil War. In recognition of this the museum will be featuring a major exhibit on the Civil War, beginning in April and running through the summer. As part of this remembrance of the Civil War, we are pleased to announce that we will be hosting the annual reunion of descendants of the 154th NY on July 16. More information on this to follow.
